She took part in many steering committees and groups, fighting for the rights of people with intellectual disabilities, helping them to live fulfilling, independent lives with appropriate supports.

Noreene humbly triumphed over four separate cancers even as she continued her noble work to dismantle systemic barriers for people with intellectual disabilities. She drew strength from her faith and was selfless in her commitment to her community, never hesitating to answer a need or a call for assistance. Her contributions to the lives she touched will continue to live on; she has truly left this world a better place than she found it.

compassion and attention to her needs and ours during her brief stay will not be easily forgotten. Mom was a very religious woman whose faith only grew stronger as more obstacles blocked her path.
